Your business' reputation could face serious damage if you fail an inspection, potentially leading to losses.

How you can prepare



Designated person

Appoint someone to be responsible for health and safety in the workplace. Someone with the experience in health and safety is ideal.



Documentation

Create documents like risk assessments or accident or near miss reporting documents and keep track of when you have used these documents.



Establish policies

Ensure that all employees in your business are aware of, and work within the established health and safety policies, and make health and safety a priority.
